

Procedure Information For Herbivores and Rodents

Before Surgery

• There are no fasting requirements for herbivores or rodents.

What to Bring

- Food and favourite treats to encourage eating after the procedure.
- Any medications they will need that day.
- A small carrier or hutch for hiding
- Some bedding

Admitting

- Please arrive at your designated admission time.
- If you have a very nervous pet, special arrangements can be made. Please call us prior to surgery.
- You will be asked to sign the consents listed in the bottom of the estimate you were sent. While the risks associated with anesthetics is low for most patients, there are risks with any procedure. Our protocol if the unexpected happens is to perform life saving measures while we try to contact you at the numbers you provide. If you are unable to be contacted we will follow the directions on the signed copy of the estimate.
- If your pet is found to have fleas, a dose of antiparasitic will be administered.

What time will the surgery be?

Specific times depend on a lot of factors including the surgical schedule for the day, as well as pre and post surgical monitoring requirements. An estimated time may not be available at drop off.

Contacting You

- We will contact you once your pet is recovering from the anesthetic. **Depending on the time of the surgery, this may not be until the later afternoon.**
- Your initial call may be from a Technician or Veterinary Assistant to let you know your pet is awake, and set up a discharge time.
- The veterinarian will call you later in the day once they are finished surgery to explain how everything went, and summarize the post operative care.

Discharge

• Post-operative care instructions are reviewed with you when you come to pick up your pet. Please ask if you would like further instruction on any aspect of their care.

Follow Up

- A technician will call you the day after the procedure to make sure everything is going well, and to answer any questions you have.
- If you have any concerns after the surgery, please contact us right away.
