Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV)-infected cats are 62x more likely to develop lymphoma than noninfected cats and can contribute to other infectious diseases or anemia by suppressing the immune system and bone marrow production.¹

Cats are at risk of becoming infected with FeLV when they are exposed to persistently infected cats; risk is highest in cats that are intact and have outdoor access.²
